



ome dreams are too big for one person to accomplish alone. But with vision, faith, and unwavering dedication, they become reality.

John was more than a visionary—he was a builder of hope. As a founding member of the Southern California Hospice Foundation's Advisory Council, he saw the need for Orange County's first end-of-life care home and took action. With his expertise as a developer and businessman, he guided the complex process of acquiring,

renovating, and licensing the Heavenly Home, transforming what once seemed impossible into a sanctuary of peace.

But what John didn't know was that this home—built for others—would one day be his own.

Just as renovations neared completion, he confided in Michelle, the Executive Director, "Sometimes I think I'm building this house for myself." A month later, he was diagnosed with stage four cancer.

John faced his diagnosis with the same courage

and selflessness that defined his life. He declined aggressive treatment, choosing instead to pour his remaining time into the mission he believed in. He attended every fundraiser, every council meeting, and continued mentoring Michelle over coffee, offering wisdom and encouragement until the very end.

Two months before his passing, John stood in the master bedroom of the Heavenly Home and softly said, "I want this to be my room. If I ever come to the Heavenly Home, this is where

I want to be."

On December 17th, that moment became reality. After a month in the hospital and major surgery, John was in a semi-coma. His wife, Krissy, knew the hospital was not where he wanted to spend his final days. That night, he was transferred to the Heavenly Home—the place he had helped create, the room he had chosen.

Friends and family gathered. The Threshold Choir sang at his bedside. A pastor anointed him with oil. On Christmas morning, Michelle and Krissy sat with him, reading the story of Christ's birth, believing that perhaps this would be his final day.

That evening, as prayers were spoken and his impact was honored, our caregivers sang Amazing Grace. Tears rolled down John's unresponsive face. At 10:25 PM, on Christmas night, he took his final breath—a peaceful passing, a beautiful farewell.

John's story is one of purpose, love, and lasting impact. His vision for the Heavenly Home

became a reality—a beautiful place where people find dignity, and compassion in their final days.

His legacy lives on in every life touched through our organization. As we continue this mission, we invite others to help ensure that no one faces the end-of-life alone. Because the greatest gift we can offer is a place where love remains until the very last breath.

HEAVENLY HOME HIGHLIGHTS

n 2024, the Heavenly Home welcomed 28 residents ranging in age from 54 to 97, with an average age of 81 years. Male residents comprised 57% of admissions, and diagnoses included Alzheimer's, senile degeneration of the brain, cancer-related illnesses, and cardiovascular conditions.

CARE AND SUPPORT METRICS

- **Days of Service:** Over 1,600 days of service were provided in 2024, reflecting a 15% increase from the previous year.
- Care Hours: Nearly 40,000 hours of care were delivered, demonstrating the staff's dedication to providing personalized, around-the-clock support.
- Specialized Fees: Flexible room rates and tailored service fees were introduced to accommodate a diverse range of financial circumstances.

TRENDS AND IMPACT

- Focus on Neurological Conditions: A significant rise in residents with Alzheimer's and other neurological conditions reinforced Heavenly Home's ability to manage complex medical needs.
- Extended Care Durations: Increased demand for sustained and specialized end-of-life care resulted in longer stays for many residents.
- **Community Support:** Generous donor contributions helped subsidize care for residents in financial need, ensuring equitable access to essential services.
- Innovative Care Models: The implementation of flexible fees and personalized care demonstrated Heavenly Home's ongoing commitment to meeting the unique needs of each resident and their families.

ARCHIE'S STORY: A LIFE OF COMPASSION

When Archie arrived at Heavenly Home in April 2023, he was given just weeks to live—but God had a different plan. For 15 months, he inspired everyone with his resilience, wisdom, and unwavering faith. In July 2024, Archie's journey on earth came to an end, but his legacy will forever remain in our hearts.

As a former pediatrician, Archie dedicated 40 years to caring for sick children. His compassion extended beyond medicine—like when he refused to give up on a young girl in a coma, speaking to her daily until she finally wiggled her toes. Or when he made a terminally ill boy's dream come true by dressing him as Zorro for one final Halloween. These

moments reflect the heart of Archie's life's work: love, dedication, and hope.

At Heavenly Home, Archie left his mark in three unforgettable ways: his passion for good food, his love for celebrations, and his deep faith. He helped elevate the dining experience for all residents, never hesitating to send a dish back if it didn't meet his high standards. He brought joy to every gathering, always present with a big smile. And most importantly, his faith remained a guiding light, reminding everyone of the power of prayer and God's presence.

Though Archie is no longer with us, his story lives on—a testament to the impact of kindness and community at Heavenly Home. He was not just a resident—he was family.



KEM'S STORY: A FINAL MOMENT IN THE SUN

A former professional football player, Kem, 74, suffered severe brain degeneration from years of repeated head injuries. His condition made finding care nearly impossible—until he arrived at Heavenly Home.

We tailored his environment to bring him comfort, placing him in a bright, peaceful room with direct access to an outdoor patio. Though bedbound, he found solace in sunlight, fresh air, and birdsong.

In his final days, Kem longed to

feel the sun on his skin one last time. We honored that wish, wheeling his hospital bed onto the patio, where he soaked in the warmth and found peace in nature's embrace. Weeks later, he passed away with the dignity and care he deserved.

Thanks to the unwavering support of our community, 2024 marked a year of growth and adaptability for the Heavenly Home. With increased admissions, extended care hours, and enhanced financial flexibility, we continued to provide exceptional end-of-life care. By responding to evolving healthcare challenges and fostering strong community engagement, the Heavenly Home remains steadfast in its mission to offer comfort to residents and their families during life's most critical moments.


Eugene's family was overwhelmed with gratitude, and we are deeply thankful to our supporters for making experiences like this possible.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we provided Augustin with a small microwave and refrigerator, restoring not just his access to food, but his dignity and independence in his final days.

Sometimes, the smallest comforts make the biggest difference.

Eric, 64, was receiving hospice care for end-stage cardiac disease. His condition, compounded by a hip injury and a previous stroke, left him with limited arm mobility, making simple daily tasks—like tying his shoes—almost impossible.

A simple gift—a pair of non-lacing athletic shoes—transformed his daily

life. Thanks to your generosity, Eric was able to move with greater ease and comfort. He was incredibly grateful, reminding us that even the smallest acts of kindness can have a profound impact.






